**Fewer Cattle In
Feed Lots**

Last minute decisions are likely to be in order this year as to the number of cattle operators will put into their feed lots, says Ed Coles, livestock marketing specialist at Oregon State college.

Coles explains a number of factors point toward fewer cattle being fed this year. A combination of what cattlemen would call two "bad" years, a tightening of credit, the "in-and-outers" staying out this year, some cattle feeders switching to hogs, large cattle numbers and position in cattle cycle all are backed up with fewer than usual cattle going into feed lots so far in 1953.

However, it is still early in the season and there are other influences that may change the feed

lot operator's mind, the specialist explains. Many regular feeders have large corn and hay crops and big cash crops of soybeans.

They also have equipment and feeding is part of their program. Feeder cattle prices are favorable and the supply is large.
