

## Materials Given For Scout Home

Plans for a Boy Scout home in Brookings grew a little closer to reality last week, as the Scout building committee began assembling materials for the construction of the building.

The total of contributed materials was rising steadily this week, as plans were brought into readiness for the actual construction to begin.

Earl C. Brown, local contractor, notified the committee Monday that he would open the driveway into the Scout building lot, previously donated by Ward King.

Brown will open the driveway as soon as surveys are completed showing just where the driveway should be.

South Coast Lumber Company, who will furnish the heavy tim-

bers for the building, plan to begin cutting them as soon as the building committee have signified that they are ready for their use.

Heavy bolts for the job have also been donated by Lake Pleasant Plywood company, and Peterson Lumber Company will cut and donate the 3x12s to be used in the building.

A number of mills and loggers have offered other materials, but they will not be listed until it is definitely determined what is needed, and what each will give.

Plans for the building are being carried forward by representatives of the Odd Fellows, Eagles and VFW at the present time, all of whom sponsor Scout troops. Two other sponsoring organizations are as yet unrepresented on the committee.

## Pasture Grasses Tried Locally

We have now established four pasture grass trials with mixtures of legumes and two fertilizer trials. The pasture grass trials have been put out on Ray Stevens place at Ophir and L. J. Pownder down at Brookings, Delmer Colegrove Sr., has a pasture grass trial on cleared hill land and Charles Brooks up at Sixes. Charles Doyle of Wedderburn is carrying a fertilizer trial on irrigated pasture and Bob Knox in Wedderburn is also carrying a fertilizer trial on sub-clover and grass. The object of these trials is not only to find the grasses and legume combinations which grow well here in Curry County but also to find the economic feasibility of fertilizer application. We know that we can not follow the recommendations of grass and fertilizer which are made in the valley and we are therefore trying to find the recommendations of the amount of fertilizer which can be used here in Curry County and still give us a return in foliage over and above the cross of our establishment of pastures and application of fertilizer. These trials will not be showing much if anything until in the early spring. At that time we hope to hold a tour and cover all of these places with an attendance of local ranchers. The cooperation I have received in putting out these trials has been well appreciated and I am still putting out more as land is available or as land is made available to me. I would particularly like to try some seedings in the ashes of burnt over hill land so if you have any of that available and would contact me I would surely appreciate your doing so.

In our 4-H re-organizational work for our 1954 program we are establishing many clubs and it appears that we will have a larger enrollment this year than we had last. We are, of course, in the same position as always, we need local club leaders to help develop these youngsters. If you are interested in becoming a 4-H leader we want you to contact the office and we will give you all the necessary information. We realize that being a local club leader is a time consumer and not easy in any way but the compensation in seeing these youngsters develop is pay of the highest type. Some of our local business men who have hobbies, such as stamps, rocks and minerals, woodworking. You name it and we have it. Contact our office and we will see that you are leading a club before the first of the coming year.

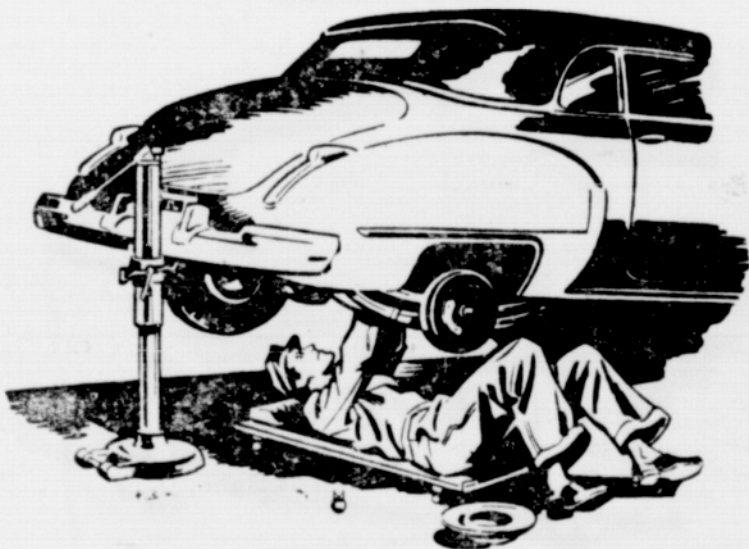
