

Class A-2 Schools Duck Brookings Schedule; Can't Figure Out Why

The Brookings High School basketball team this week faced a practically gameless schedule, as Class A-2 schools ducked the local team.

Only two games have been scheduled for the year, outside the district tournament. They are a home and home series with Illinois Valley.

Other Class A schools refused to send their teams to meet the Bruins. Most of them gave travel difficulties as their reason, although they schedule schools farther away than Brookings. One of them, Eagle Point, had their pants beaten off them here last year when Brookings was still a B school, but didn't give that as their reason.

Under the Athletic Association constitution schools may refuse to play other schools of the same classification, as long as they meet them in the tournament. Thus, no one can be required to face Brookings, which is too big for Class B, and unpopular with Class A.

Lynn Hampton, superintendent of schools here, immediately moved against the dissenting schools with an amendment to the constitution which would require other A schools to play here. In it he had the support of Coos Bay, Eugene, Lebanon, Taft and Bandon.

The amendment will be presented at the regular meeting of the Association next month.

The Class A-2 schools which find Brookings so remote, as well

as their past records so impressive, are Eagle Point, Phoenix and Crater, in addition to Illinois Valley. Class A schools which might meet Brookings in the tournament are Grants Pass, Medford, Klamath Falls and Ashland.
