**Ambulance Costs More to Ride**

Ambulance rates for the Brookings-Harbor Community ambulance were raised this week, in an effort to keep the ambulance on a self-sustaining basis.

Members of the non-profit group raised the fee from fifteen cents per mile for the vehicle to twenty-five cents per mile.

The raise was necessary, according to Roy Brown, driver of the ambulance, to keep the service from going into the red. The original fund for the ambulance was raised by public subscription, and Mr. Brown said they felt the people should not be called upon to donate again to maintain the service.

Under the new rates, a trip to the Crescent City hospital will cost \$10.50 for ambulance fees. Previously the charge was \$9.10.

Some of the business houses who have not been asked for a cash donation will be called upon for donations of materials as they are needed for the building. If the majority are as generous as Mr. Bankus and Mr. Salvage have been with materials, and Roy Weideman and his crew have been with their time, then the success of the project is assured.

The librarian reported the arrival of four more new books

which had been ordered and also three others which have been donated. The library received two copies of "A Century of Coos and Curry" one from the South Coast Lumber Co. and one from Chetco Home & Auto Supply. She also reported that Linda Coslett, a school girl, has offered her services to the library on Friday afternoons and from the help which she gave last week promises to make a real librarian some day.

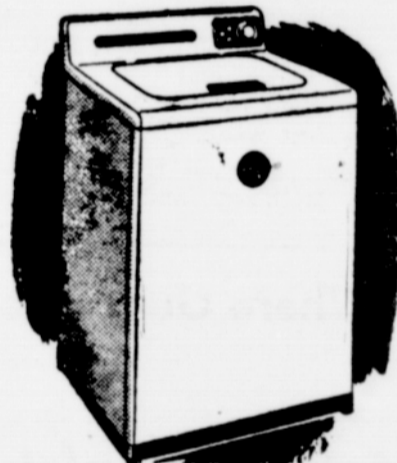
