

Family Traditions Recommended For Forming Home Ties

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—Building family traditions is an excellent way to develop and strengthen family ties and the coming holiday season offers good opportunities to start some special home activities, an Oregon State college family life specialist suggests.

While traditions should be fitted to meet the interests and feeling of the individual family, holidays and special days are good starting points, Dr. Lester A. Kirkendall believes.

Thanksgiving dinner with a gathering of the entire family and relatives, cutting the Christmas tree, singing carols, making family resolutions, or presenting programs during the holidays with young and old alike participating are all examples of traditions that help give meaning to family life.

An important result of the traditions is the "sense of belonging" and unity that comes to members of the family, Dr. Kirkendall points out. Youngsters look forward to the special events and are tied closely into the family circle.

The daily little experiences shouldn't be overlooked in favor of only big events, however, the family life authority insists. Reading aloud on winter evenings, Sunday afternoon rides, helping with the dishes, or family scrapbook making are all activities that can take on special meaning.

Survey your pattern of family living to find at what points something of the nature of traditions now exist, or can be de-

veloped, he suggests to parents as a starting place.

Then plan for their development by carefully organizing and "talking up" the event. When it's over, discuss the activities and determine whether they should be kept alive as a family tie. The good events, experience has shown, will get a sincere response and add to the happiness in the home.
