

DENMARK, OREGON BOY TO PLAY WITH CHICAGO SYMPHONY

Wilbur Jensen, 15, Denmark, will be trumpet soloist with the Chicago Symphony orchestra in a concert opening the National 4-H Club Congress November 28 in Chicago. Word of his selection has just been received by Burton Hutton, state 4-H club leader.

The Curry county 4-H member has previously appeared on other national 4-H programs. At the Chicago congress two years ago he took part in the Share the Fun breakfast, and in March 1952, appeared on "U. S. Royal Showcase," nationally televised program, on a National 4-H Club Week show.

The Langlois high school freshman has received other honors recently for his musical ability. In June he won first place on the Horace Heidt amateur show at Coos Bay and took second place on the same show in Los Angeles.

During the summer he made three appearances with the Portland Summer Concert band, and because of his acclaim was called back for a fourth concert.

Selections he will play as soloist with the Chicago Symphony are "Czardas" by Monte, "Trumpeter's Lullaby" by Anderson, and "Dance Boheme" from "Carmen" by Bizet.

Rounding out his interests are 4-H club work. This year he was president of his livestock club and raised a dairy type calf, a beef type calf and a lamb, all of which he showed at the county fair.

Shipment of chromite ores for the first six months of 1953 were up 120 per cent over last year, according to figures released by the US Bureau of mines.
