DEPUTY TO VISIT LODGE

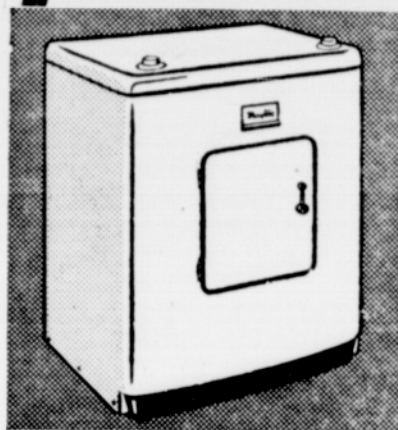

Violet Schiewe and her twin sister, Viola Mosier were surprised with a party on their birthday, November 5.

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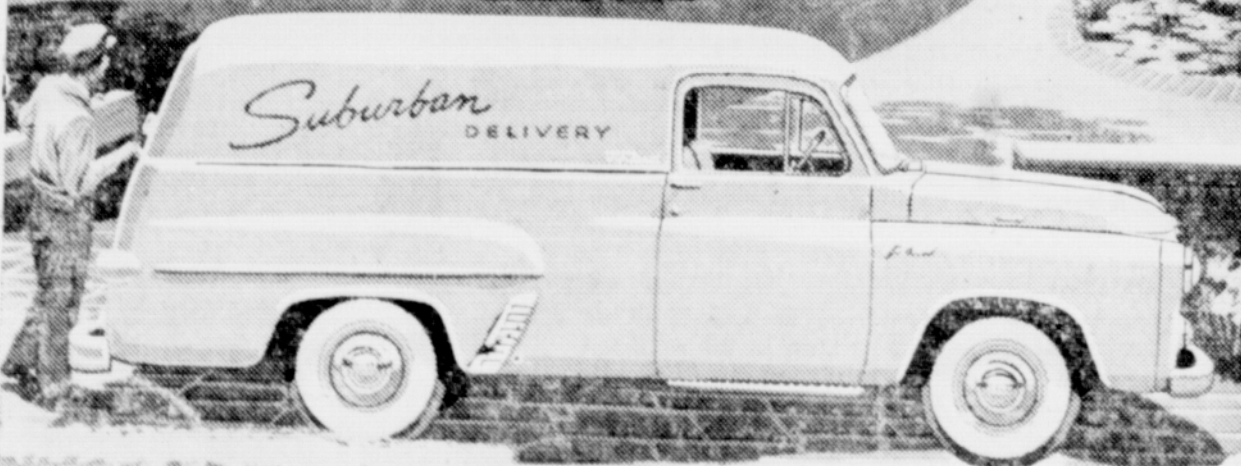
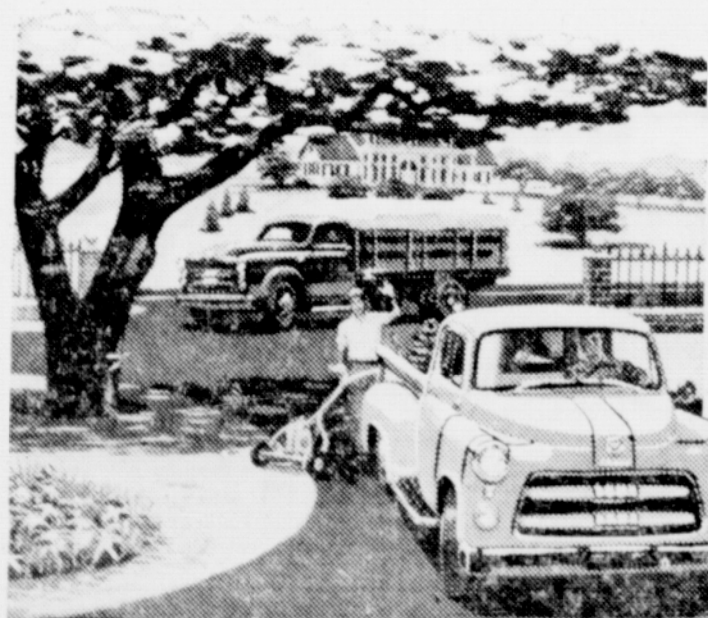
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
