Local citizens honored their Four-H club youngsters and leaders in the annual Achievement night, held Saturday at the school.

Under the chairmanship of Leo Lucas, recognition was given the boys, girls and leaders who have accomplished so much in the Four-H program this last year.

Over sixty youngsters received honors for the work they had done, as well as eight or ten leaders.

Top honors went to Nancy Chapin, who took the award as the outstanding Four-H youngster of Curry County... although Nancy wasn't there.

Chairman Lucas told the group that Curry County has a higher per capita number of children participating in Four-H than in any other county in Oregon. He also said that over a hundred more youngsters here would like to participate in Four-H, but have not been able to because of lack of leaders.

Achievement night was sponsored locally by the Brookings-Harbor Rotary Club.

The planes are operated by Mercy Flights Inc., a non-profit organization, and are used for emergency flights from isolated areas. A large number of Brookings residents subscribe to the service.

Definite scheduling of the planes cannot be made because of the lack of long-range weather forecasts, on the coast. However, the planes will come the weekend that weather conditions permit.

Radio stations in Eureka and Crescent City will announce the arrival a day or so before they come, and a notice will also be posted on the Post-Office Bulletin board.

Local residents will be informed of the arrival, also by the planes. They are large, white planes with a red-cross on the wings, and will circle the city three times before landing at Crissey Municipal airport.
