New CARE Packages Ready For Christmas Delivery

"Operation Reindeer," to carry American Christmas greetings to 500,000 needy families in 16 overseas countries in the form of a \$1 food package containing nearly 11 pounds of food, was announced this week by CARE.

Paul Comly French, executive director of the world-wide non-profit welfare agency, said, "The United States government and CARE are cooperating in this effort to bring good will and Christmas cheer to our friends in Europe and South America." He explained that foodstuffs going into these special CARE packages originally were purchased by the U.S. government.

"They now have been made available by the foreign operations administration to CARE for distribution during the Christmas season in special areas of need

around the world, such as the sections of England and the Netherlands that bore the brunt of the flood disaster earlier this year, he said.

"A dollar will send any of these packages tax-free to any part of these 16 countries. I am certain that the American people will jump at the opportunity to participate in this great good-will enterprise and to express their individual Christmas wishes in a substantial form."

Each of the packages contains the following nourishing foods: 2 tins (14½ oz. each) of evaporated milk, 1 lb. prunes, 1 lb. dried beans, 2 lbs. sugar, 2 lbs. vegetable shortening; 30 oz. of beef in gravy, and 1 lb. rice. The price includes the customary CARE guarantee of free delivery.

Countries to which these 500,000 good-will packages will go include: Finland, France, West Germany (including the western zones of Berlin), Greece, Italy, the Netherlands, Norway, United Kingdom (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland), and Yugoslavia; Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Ecuador, Haiti, Panama and Peru.

CARE mission chiefs in all of these countries have been directed to make distribution in close cooperation with local welfare organizations, so the packages actually will be distributed among the people most in need.

Any American wishing to participate in "Operation Reindeer" may forward his order for any number of these good-will packages to Oregon CARE headquarters at Lipman Wolfe and company, or to Oregon CARE outlets in Eugene and Klamath Falls.

Chauffeur's License Needs New Form

Oregon drivers wishing to renew their chauffeur's licenses must fill out a renewal application form this year, the secretary of state's driver license division reminded this week.

Forms are available at any department of state branch office and at the Salem headquarters office.

The renewal form must be used instead of filling out the reverse side of the current chauffeur's license itself, officials stressed, in order to avoid delay in processing the application and issuing the new permit. All chauffeur's licenses expire December 31 of each year, while regular driver's licenses expire every other year on the birthdate of the holder.

Chauffeur's license renewal fee is \$1.00.
