**Time to Get Cars Ready
For Cold Weather Driving**

With the cold weather season at hand, L. R. Knepper, manager of the Emergency Road Service department of the Oregon State Motor Association, has reminded motorists that it is time to make cars ready for winter driving.

There are several things to be done besides adding anti-freeze, Knepper said, pointing to the findings of the AAA service experts who tabulated the calls made to 19,000 service stations giving emergency road service to members. Winter is the peak season for such calls, many of them avoidable with a little precaution.

Knepper suggested the following winterizing steps:

Flush the cooling system before adding anti-freeze.

Check the lubrication system and add the proper oil for winter.

The electric system, tires, battery and engine should also be checked, with attention to lights and the windshield wiper and washer which may need adjust-

ment after a summer of dry weather.

"Smooth treads on tires won't hold on slippery pavement," Knepper said. "A poorly adjusted or faulty electric system will run down the battery and in cold weather may cause a car to start with great difficulty or not at all. Resulting costs from a faulty electric system can be more than the cost of a check-up by a reliable garage. There is no doubt our experience shows that car owners spend considerable money needlessly early in winter because they haven't had a check up after a summer of hard driving."
