on designated four lane highways.

There are a few states still
without the law, Ray Conway,
manager of the Oregon State Mo-
tor Association announced, but
the uniform vehicle code in this
respect has been adopted by so
many states that he is reminding
the members of the Oregon Asso-
ciation not to take chances in any
state.

matter what state you are in or
which way you are going, you
better stop for a school bus," Con-
