Water stood around the Hendrie house on the Winchuck, although it did not get in, and the Hendries didn't rescue their car until Tuesday.

A curious feature of the weather was the fact that the temperature during the storm stayed almost stationary, at 55 degrees. Although the 9.32 inches of rain at Brookings was substantial, it was nothing like the amazing rain at Gasquet, which sent the Smith upward 30 feet.

Nick Turner upheld the tradition of getting the mail through although there were places where he had to get out and push a muck stick to make it, the worst being at an old slide near Brother Colegrove's ranch.

An amusing feature of the storm was comparison between the forecasts of standard radio programs and the short wave data sent out to ships at sea. For two days the newscasters told of more storms imminent while the seafarers were told that the storm center was nearly stationary, roughly, about off Prince Rupert, where the barometer stood at 28.38 inches.

Monday, "ham" radio stations

were trying to make contact with Gold Beach. County Judge Guy Forsyth was seriously ill with pneumonia, at Port Orford, and had to be removed to a hospital. It is said he was brought south, packed around a slide at Arizona Inn.
