Highway 101 Out At Coquille; Others Open

Flood waters and slides which had cut Brookings off from the rest of the world were being brought under control today, and travel was possible in most directions, although extreme caution was advised by the State Highway department.

Highway 101 North was still closed between Coquille and Bandon, where the Coquille river was over the highway embankment. The road was open up to that point.

Travel was possible south along 101 all the way, although detours were still in effect between Crescent City and Brookings.

Highway 99 was open all the way, so that it is possible to get to northern points in Oregon.

Charles O. Porter, Eugene attorney, announced last week that he will be a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Representative in Congress from the Fourth District.

Porter thus became the first candidate of the year to throw his hat in the ring for the seat now occupied by Harris Ellsworth, Roseburg Republican.

Porter has been a practicing attorney in Eugene for two years. Prior to that he was Assistant to the Director of the American Bar Association Survey of Legal Practice.

A graduate of Eugene Schools, Porter took his A.B. and Law degrees with honors at Harvard. He is a veteran of World War II, and a Captain in the Air Force Reserve.
