

VFW Parking Improvements Planned

So many people are interested in what is planned at the VFW property in the way of improving parking areas, that a description of what is in mind may be of order.

As far as the Pioneer road side is concerned, the approach from there has been ruined. Besides, it is only a forty foot street, and a busy one at that, which will be still busier as the school plans to handle bus-student transfers at the Easy street-Pioneer road corner. The veterans will undertake to make the emergency exit on that side safe, with additional, lateral steps to the sidewalk grade and a hand rail. The bank will be suitably sloped but no major approach on that side is contemplated.

On the Pacific avenue side, where there are branching, sixty foot streets abutting the property for over 150 feet, a co-operative development is contemplated under the direction of City Engineer

O. Arp. It is planned to remove some 1500 yards of dirt bringing the subgrade down along that side so it can be hard surfaced. Tentative plans call for a concrete retaining wall between the level of the VFW property and the street grade, with inset steps approximately in line with the front of the building and a ramp near the northeast corner, allowing some parking in front of the building and access to the service entrance.

The veterans and their ladies, however, have committed all available funds to improve the building, with a store room and complete renovation of the dining area. Expenditures on other projects must await future income but, possibly, by the time the grading project can be tackled, some funds may be there. It is expected the city and school board will help some.
