Impressive Ceremony to Mark Presbyterian Organization

The organizational meeting of Brookings Presbyterian Church will be held this Sunday at four o'clock. The services will be held in the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

The service will mark the formal organization of a church which began with a meeting held here on September 15, 1952.

Two services will be held this Sunday, with the regular 11 o'clock morning service being carried out as usual. The Reverend Dwayne L. Proett of Peace Memorial Church, Klamath Falls will conduct the regular service.

Reverend Proett, who is moderator of the Presbytery of Southern Oregon, will also preside during the organizational services. Speaker at the afternoon service will be Dr. G. Henry Green, executive of the Synod of Oregon.

Special music for the afternoon service will be furnished by the choir of Gold Beach Presbyterian

Church, and by the Reverend Wayne Wattman of Glendale Presbyterian Church.

A number of special representatives will be present from the Presbytery for the service, which will include the ordination of the first elders of the Church.

The organization marks the completion of the new church's founding here in 1952. Beginning with the meeting in 1952, the church has grown steadily to its present position.

Rev. Hugh Bronson became minister of the church here in March, 1953, and first services of the fledgling church were held then. The church met at the Chetco Inn until July, when it moved to the VFW hall, with one service in between held at Azalea Lanes.

Present plans, according to Rev. Bronson, are for the church to remain at the VFW hall until their new church is completed.

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Work Planned On Scout Building

With clearing skies in the offing, members of the Scout Building committee are ready to try to begin construction on the building again.
