

New Limit On Fish In Effect

The special season on the coast and in the lower Columbia and tributaries on jack salmon during which time a special bag limit of ten such fish was permitted ended on November 15.

Anglers are reminded that in the streams and lakes in western Oregon now open to angling with the exception of the Rogue, the daily bag limit is two fish 12 inches or over in length and the weekly or possession limit is four such fish. This bag limit will remain in effect throughout the winter season.

In the eastern part of the state, the daily bag limit remains at two salmon or steelhead 20 inches or over in length and four such fish in seven days or in possession. A list of all waters now open to trout, steelhead, and salmon angling is included on pages 34 through 40 in the current angling regulations booklet.

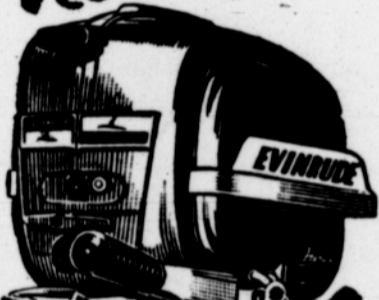
