

BRUINS TAKE THIRD, 44-43

The Brookings Bruins kept their season record bright and shining Tuesday night, as they slid past the Del Norte Warriors, 44 to 43 at Crescent City.

And the Bruins were right back at their old tricks, pulling this one out of the fire in the last few minutes of play.

To win, Brookings had to put on a last-period rally to erase a Crescent City lead which at one time reached seven points. The Warriors had taken command in the last quarter after trailing Brookings all through the game.

The Bruins led at the half, 22 to 15, and were still ahead at the three-quarter mark, 30-27. The Warriors caught them early in the quarter and held their lead until Brookings roared into the stretch to pull it out.

The Western twins, Ron and Ray, divided scoring honors for the evening, with 16 points each. Kolheuer and Hintz led the Warriors with nine apiece.

Cliff Girod's JV squad took their third passing, as the Warriors thumped them, 38 to 18. Half time score was 20 to 7.
