four point lead on three gift  
shots.

Ray Western led the scoring  
parade Saturday as he potted 26  
points, but he was almost match-  
ed by Barton of Illinois Valley  
with 22. Ron Western had 17  
for Brookings.

In the boisterous fourth quarter  
the Bruins, trying frantically to  
stay in front, almost ran out of  
men. Dennis Phetteplace came out  
of the game in the last few min-  
utes with both eyes closed after  
a melee on the floor, and a few  
minutes later Ron Western fouled  
out. Seconds later Barton, Illi-  
nois Valley's sparkplug, took a  
clout over the head that brought  
the blood streaming down his  
face, but he stayed in to finish.

Cliff Girod's J. V. team didn't  
fare so well against the Cougars,  
dropping a pair, 38 to 23 and 43-39.

In the opener, the Bruins had a  
hard time getting started, failing  
to score in the first quarter, while  
the Cougars galloped to a 10 point  
lead. The Bruins managed to stay  
within hailing distance, but never  
got close.

At Brookings, the Bruin J. V.s  
opened strong, but wilted before  
superior height of the visitors.  
They led at the quarter 12-9 and  
24-18 at the half, but Illinois Val-  
ley took command in the 3rd quar-  
ter and were never headed.

For the varsity, it was their  
last foray against District Class  
A-2 competition until the district  
tournament. Illinois Valley is the  
only team which would schedule  
them, and an attempt to force  
other district teams to meet  
Brookings has ended, in failure.  
Competition from here on in will  
be with B schools and Class A  
schools from outside the district,  
starting with Crescent City Tues-  
day night.
