

CHRISTMAS SEAL RETURNS UP; TO BE SOLD AT BANK

Volunteers of two women's organizations will staff a Christmas Seal Booth at the Oregon State Bank, Brookings, from December 14 to December 18, according to Mrs. Irene H. Koeller, county chairman of Christmas seal sales.

The booth will operate for the convenience of those who have not received seals in the mail, or for those who wish to buy additional seals or bring in their contributions in person, according to Mrs. Koeller.

Sale of the Christmas seals will continue through December. The Curry County Tuberculosis and Health Association says they need to increase sales in order to increase its efforts to find all the people who have TB, so they may be treated and cured.

Tuberculosis does exist in Curry County, and the Association is helping to take care of the cases. There are:

6 cases of Tuberculosis in the hospital.

4 cases of active Tuberculosis awaiting beds in the hospital.

3 active cases of Tuberculosis who are confined to their homes.

6 cases of arrested Tuberculosis who are out of the hospital, but who are carefully watched by the Public Health Nurse, Dorothea Miller of Gold Beach.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Koeller reported that first returns from Christmas seal letters mailed to county residents the latter half of November amounted to \$698.75. Last year's receipts for the same period were \$566.25.

The Curry County Tuberculosis and Health Association is conducting a program of which all can be proud. Christmas presents us with an opportunity to show our appreciation of the work it has done, of work it will continue to do, as long as the people of Curry County stand back of it.

Now is the time to say "thank you, keep it up." Now is the time to buy Christmas Seals.
