**BRUINS WINNING STREAK HALTED;
LOSE TO POWERS, DEL NORTE**

The man-shy Brookings Bruins saw their three game winning streak come to an abrupt halt as they dropped a pair of games on the home floor.

Saturday night they lost a heartbreaker to the Powers Timbercruisers, 47 to 45. And Tuesday the Del Norte Warriors gained revenge as they thumped the Bruins, 64 to 50.

The Powers game was a rough one to lose. After trailing through the first quarter, the Bruins moved into the lead midway in the second period, 16-14. The teams matched baskets until the half, which ended with Brookings leading 21-19.

From there on, the two teams battled on even terms. Warner moved the Cruisers in front early in the half with a tip-in that made it 23-21, but Raleigh Burr tied it with a push shot from the circle. The Cougars moved out again, but Ray Western brought the Bruins back with a lay-in, and Ken Russell followed with a long one that closed the gap. At the quarter it was 32-31, Powers.

The Bruins moved at one time into a five point lead in the final quarter but Powers whittled away until they tied it at 39-all. Jerry Brewer made it 41-39, but Walker of Powers sank a foul and a field goal to send the Cruisers ahead.

With one minute left, Burr

dropped one from the center to make it 43-42, Brookings, and Walker roared back with another. Warren dropped a lay-in, and Walker again dropped one from behind the circle, to make it 45-44. Then, with five seconds left, Jack Russell arched one from the center that went through—only to find that Walker had been fouled on his shot, and that his basket wasn't good. Walker sank his foul, and that was the game.

Walker of Powers took scoring honors, with 20 points. Ray Western had 18.

The Crescent City game was a ragged one, that saw the Warriors jump into an early lead and hold it. They led at 16 to 10 at the quarter and 30-21 at the half.

Ray Western again led the Bruins with 18 points, although Hintz of the Warriors topped him with 20.
