

Woman Found Guilty On Two Assault Charges

Diva Stoller, Brookings, was fined sixty dollars and given a suspended jail sentence by Municipal Judge Hans Nelson, Tuesday, after being found guilty of assault and battery and disorderly conduct.

Mrs. Stoller had been arrested on the complaint of Mary Mederis of Brookings, who accused Mrs. Stoller of striking and slapping her. A cross complaint against Miss Mederis was dismissed by the judge.

A parade of seven witnesses subpoenaed by the court testified that Mrs. Stoller had been the aggressor in a row between the two in Ken's Tavern on November 23.

Mrs. Stoller elected originally to serve a jail sentence rather than paying her fine, but after having been escorted to the jail by Police Chief Bud Cross she changed her mind.

Judge Nelson lectured the accused very strongly after termination of the trial. "How can we", he asked, "expect to control our juvenile problem here with the spectacle of grown women brawling in the taverns before them?"

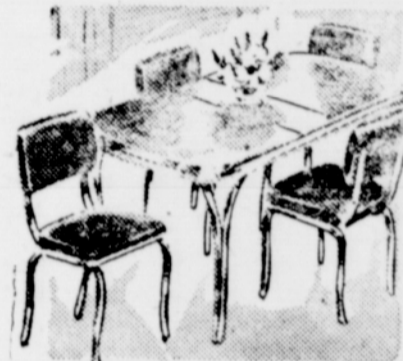
