Few Pink Salmon Showing Up

A comparative stranger to Oregon waters has put in an appearance lately on at least two coastal streams. Reports of pink salmon, though not unheard of before, are rare. These are the salmon that make a great part of the commercial catch in the streams of Alaska and northern British Columbia and normally are not found in Oregon streams though they do pass the coast during their migrations.

One pink was caught above tidewater in the Sixes river and three others were observed on a spawning redd in Beaver creek, which is a tributary of the Nestucca river.

The pink is the smallest of the five Pacific salmon using the North American streams.
