The Bears confounded the experts by tossing an old-fashioned zone defense at the Del Norte Warriors to take them, 39-29, but a week later the Crescent City boys had figured it out, and won going away, 52 to 40.

In between, Gold Beach pulled away from the Bruins Tuesday to win the first game in their series, 61 to 49.
