Thursday, January 28, in the extension office starting at 8:00 p.m., for all organizations who would like to have a concession at our 1954 fair to send representatives to discuss the rules and regulations and the contracts with Ken Thompson, our fair board manager. This will be an opportunity for all organizations desiring to raise money for their own program to do so by carrying a concession at the county fair. As you know our fair grounds space is limited so we urge all organizations to get in early by attending this meeting.

Now is the time while as roses are as dormant as they ever get in this climate to apply a thorough application of lime sulphur. Prior to the application of lime sulphur you rose growers should prune out spindly and old cankered wood, remove old blooms and do a thorough job of raking up the dead leaves on the ground round the rose garden. In such trash many rose diseases are harbored for protectural infection next spring. Following this sanitation program the spray recommendation is lime sulphur at the rate of 1 pint in 1 gallon of spray. This is equivalent to 8 gallons of lime sulphur in 100 gallons of spray for commercial rose planting. The final pruning and shaping of rose bushes should be completed about the end of this month. A warning against the possibility of discoloration of white paint trellises and walls that results from drift of the lime sulphur spray should be noted. If your rose bushes are planted against the white trellis or a white wall a cardboard or plywood shield can be used to prevent spray drifting onto the paint. Bordeaux mixture is sometimes used where paint discoloration is a major problem. However, it is not considered as satisfactory as lime sulphur. Where the opportunity arises between showers, this is a desirable time to carry out a general sanitation program in all the perennial and shrub planting around the garden, breaking up and disposal of old leaves with removal of dead flowers and seed pods is desirable from a disease control standpoint.
