Forest Service Replants Trees

About 100,000 two-year-old Douglas fir trees are being heeled in on a 200-acre tract some four miles up the south bank of the Chetco river, near here. The area being reforested was logged off by the South Coast mill, and was burned over under the supervision of the U. S. Forest Service, the land being within the reserve. Five men are doing the work under the direction of Willis Ragland, district ranger. The trees came from the Wind River nursery at Carson, Wash., and are going in on the Mill Creek-Nellie Creek watersheds.

sors to agree on what constitutes market value under "normal conditions"—the present accepted base for tax valuation.

In Curry county, Loggan said, from the experience of the commission in aiding in a limited appraisal in Brookings, tax assessments are undoubtedly inequitable. The remedy for that condition, he said, is public pressure upon the officials of the county to have the area reappraised.

There is difficulty, Loggan said, in building up support for reappraisal, because many people fear that it will culminate in higher taxes. What it actually does, he said, is equalizes them, and bases them upon the true value of the property being taxed.

Loggan made his talk at the annual banquet of the chamber, which saw the installation of new officers, headed by President Karl Ostberg. The guests were served an impressive dinner by the ladies of the Assembly of God church.

He is survived by daughter, Mrs. Vida Jean Colmere, of Lakeport, Calif., and six grandchildren: brothers Clark of Taft, Calif., and Floyd of Coos Bay; sister, Mrs. Gladys Kindell, Brookings, and half sisters, Mrs. Alice Goings, Brookings, Mrs. Annie Lucas, Harbor, and Mrs. Ida Schofield of Crescent City.
