

BRUINS TAKE PAIR OF VICTORIES FROM LANGLOIS, GOLD BEACH

The Brookings Bruins went right on with their new-found habit of thumping the opposition last week, as they cleaned Gold Beach and Langlois in a pair of tilts.

Friday they took Gold Beach, 74 to 59, to revenge an earlier defeat at the hands of their northern neighbors, and Saturday they ruined Langlois, swamping the poor Cheesemakers, 107 to 36.

The Gold Beach game was decided in the first half as the Bruins moved out in front, 21 to 9, in the first quarter. They held a 40 to 22 lead at half-time, and coasted in the second half.

Jerry Brewer topped Brookings scorers with a sparkling 23-point performance. Ray Western had 18 and Raleigh Burr scored 14 for the Bruins. For Gold Beach Allord took scoring honors with 14 points.

In Saturday's game, it just wasn't nice at all. The Bruins led Langlois, 31 to 12, at the end of the first quarter, and 52 to 19 at the half. Art Guthrie cleaned the bench as he ran in all the substitutes he could find, but the Bears refused to stop scoring.

Everybody got into the act. Ken Russell and Jerry Brewer had 20 points apiece, and Raleigh Burr had 18. Ray Western had 16. Langlois was topped by Robbins, who had 13.

It wasn't such a nice weekend for the JV. The Cubs dropped a heartbreaker to Gold Beach in overtime, after seesawing through the regular time.

The Bruins led 11 to 9 at the quarter, and 29 to 25 at the half. Then, in a disastrous third period which saw Brookings score only three points, Gold Beach moved ahead, only to have the Bruins tie it in the final quarter at 44 all. In the overtime Brookings got five, but Gold Beach got six.

Scoring honors went to Jerry Weaver who got 14. Ralph Ingle had 12, and Dennis Graham 11. Gardner topped Gold Beach with
