

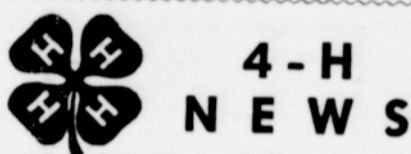
## DeMolay Chapter To Install

## DRIVE AGAINST HEMOPHILIA ON

The "Chip-in-for-a-pint" drive of the Northern California Chapter of the Hemophilia foundation is on again, according to Mrs. Presley Tryon, of Fort Dick, director of the foundation.

And its goal, as always, is to save the unfortunates who suffer with Hemophilia from bleeding to death or from being permanently crippled by the strange disease.

Hemophilia is a disease for which there is no cure at present, Mrs. Tryon reports. But its victims may be saved by wholesale blood transfusions, and by orthopedic work which has been successful in straightening crippled joints.

The illness is an inherited one, in which the disease is passed on by the females to the subsequent males. The daughters of a Hemophilic will all be carriers, and their sons may suffer from the disease.

Purpose of the foundation, said Mrs. Tryon, is to provide blood for the hemophiliacs who are always in danger of bleeding to death. Their blood lacks the fac-

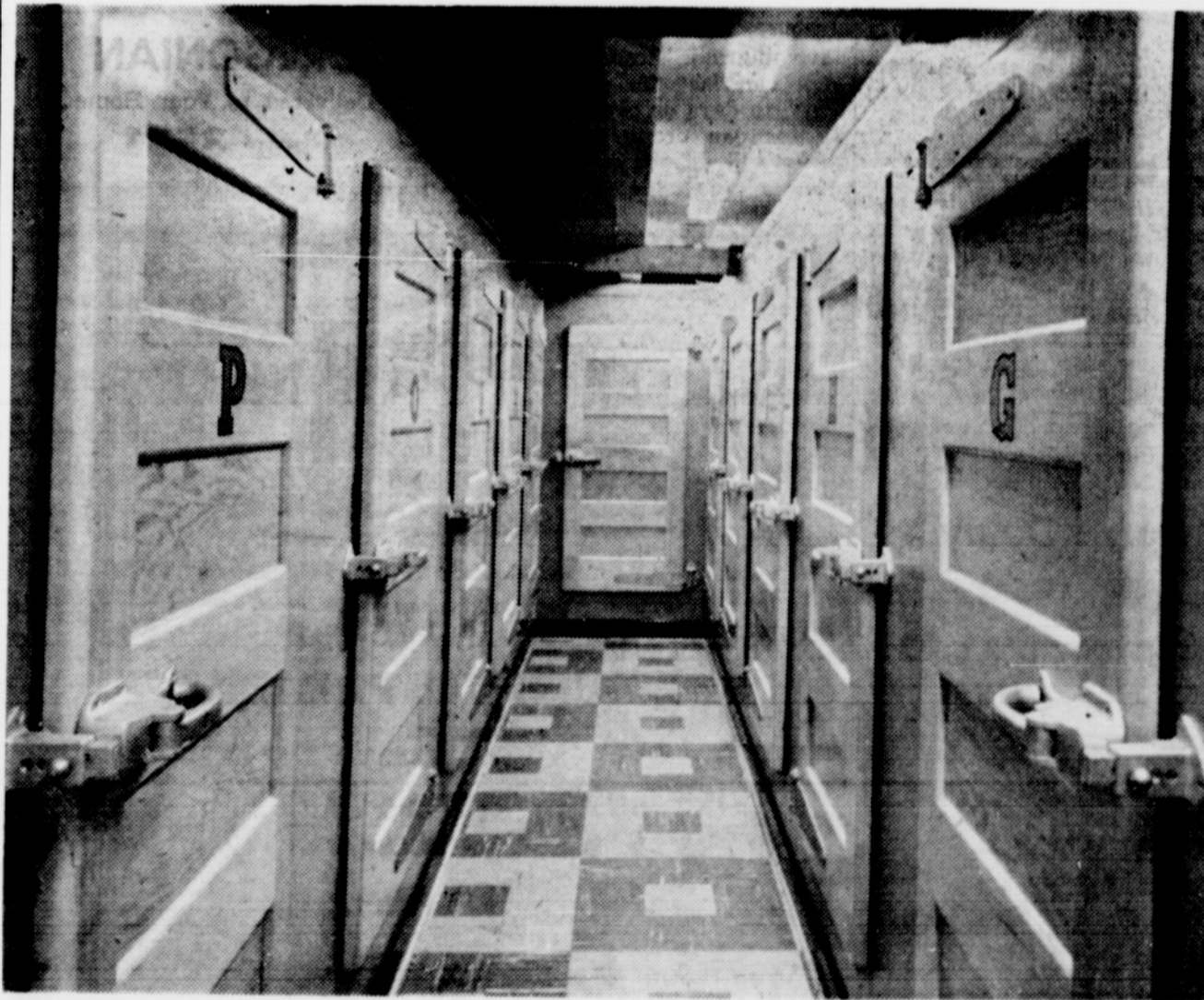
