Mrs. Foster's room won the attendance prize.

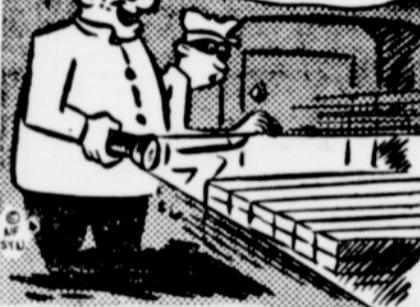
