

Mrs. Rogers To Head Easter Seal Sales in County

Mrs. Glenn Rogers of Brookings, Oregon, has been named Chairman of the annual Easter Seal Sale in Curry County, Dr. Morgan Odell, state chairman of the Easter Seal sale, has announced.

The seal sale is held annually for a month-long period immediately preceding Easter Sunday, and the dates this year will be March 18 to April 18. The Easter Seal sale is sponsored by the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

Assisting Mrs. Rogers in Curry County will be the following persons: Mr. C. J. Meyer, County Treasurer, Gold Beach, Mrs. Jane Day, City Chairman, Gold Beach, and Mrs. Eulla Mostropolito, Lily Sale Chairman, Langlois.

The task of preparing the Easter Seals for mailing to residents of Curry county has been under way for several weeks. The first seals will go into the mails on approximately March 18, and Mrs. Rogers urges the county's residents to respond as soon as possible.

"The sale of Easter Seals provides the principle means of support for the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults," Mrs. Rogers said, "and hundreds of physically handicapped Oregonians are counting on your purchase of seals to help them."

Mrs. Rogers explained that the society offers its services and facilities to those persons who cannot qualify for assistance from any other agency, either public or private.

Society projects include the Children's Hospital School at Eugene, where youngsters from more than 20 Oregon counties receive special education, care and treatment; a summer camp for crippled children near Reedsport; a speech center in Portland and the Craft Shop of the Handicapped in Portland.

New Fishing Rules Ready Soon

Copies of the synopsis of 1954 Oregon angling regulations published by the Oregon Game Commission will be available throughout the state on about March 15.

As soon as the booklets are received from the state printer in Salem, the supply and service staff of the game commission in Portland packages them and prepares to mail them to license agencies. None of the regulations booklets are sent out until all agencies can receive a supply.

This year's booklet has for a cover illustration, an eastern brook trout rising to an immature aquatic fly. The picture is a reproduction of a drawing by Harold Cramer Smith, game commission staff artist.

Basic contents of the booklet are the same as in recent years, but several definitions and explanations of legal tackle have been added for the benefit of the angler.

There are 375,000 copies of the rule book being printed to insure that every Oregon angler can have a copy and so that all out of state requests can be filled.

The 1954 hunting regulations will not be set until July and copies of the regulations are usually not available for distribution until the latter part of August.

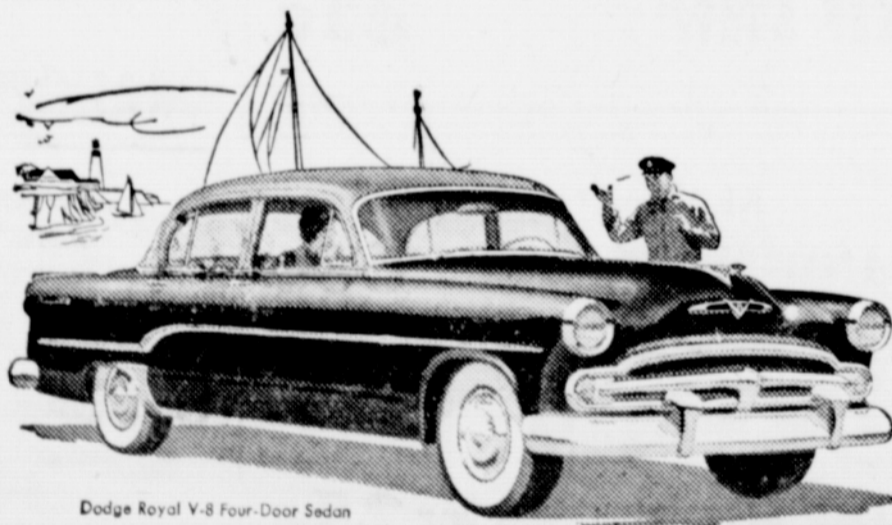
