

## Charles Doane Enters County Judge Race

Charles F. Doane of Gold Beach filed last week for the Democratic nomination for Curry County Judge.

Doane was the fourth Democrat and seventh to enter the crowded race.

A resident of Gold Beach for two years, Doane previously resided at Langlois, where he operated a cattle ranch. Prior to that time he was employed by the U.S. Army Engineers, in a position which took him over a large part of the world.

Doane has had previous experience in county Government, having served as a Coos County Commissioner from 1933 to 1936. He has resided in the Coos-Curry area most of his life, except for his Engineering days.

In his campaign statement, Doane proposed the hiring of a competent road supervisor to take care of Curry County Roads, and opposed proposals for a new court house at the present time, and the hiring of a juvenile probation officer.

The primary election will see Doane opposed by three other Democrats, Archie Kerber, Marvin Shields and D. S. Wallace. All are residents of Gold Beach.

## BROOKINGS BEAVERS TO PLAY IN NEW LEAGUE, ON NEW DIAMOND

There'll be baseball in Brookings this summer, although it may not be at the same old stand, according to Pete Lesmeister, Business Manager of the Brookings Baseball Association.

Plans for the season were just about completed after three meetings, two with league officials, and one locally, Pete announced this week.

The Beavers will probably be playing on a diamond in the vicinity of the Brookings Plywood Company, at least for part of the season. The diamond formerly used by the club will probably be destroyed by construction of the new high school, scheduled to take place this summer.

And the diamond isn't the only thing that'll be different. The Beavers will be playing in a four team Southern Oregon League this year. Other entries will be Roseburg, Grants Pass and Medford.

Last year's Southwest Oregon League has been split into two parts, with Coquille, Bandon, Coos Bay-North Bend and Drain playing each other up, North.

The Southern Oregon league will play a twelve game schedule, each team meeting every other team four times. Brookings opens at Grants Pass May 23d, and faces Medford in its first home game May 30.

Don Faber, of Central Point is President of the newly organized Southern-Oregon League. George Latimer of Grants Pass is Secretary.

## Ellsworth Files For Reelection As Congressman

Harris Ellsworth, Representative in Congress from the Fourth Congressional District of Oregon, today filed with the Secretary of State his formal declaration of candidacy for nomination and reelection.

Congressman Ellsworth has represented Oregon's Fourth District in Congress since 1943. This district includes Linn, Lane, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Josephine and Jackson counties. Ellsworth's home is in Roseburg where he was editor of the Roseburg News-Review from 1929 until he was elected to Congress. A resident of Oregon all but the first year of his life, the Congressman was educated in Oregon public schools and was graduated from the University of Oregon in 1922.

Ellsworth is third ranking member of the powerful House Rules Committee and for several years has been a member of the Republican Policy Committee of the House. The Rules Committee is considered to be unusually important in the House of Representatives for the reason that it must pass upon all legislation which goes to the floor.

Bills sponsored by Congressman Ellsworth which became law include forestry legislation, the conversion of the Camp White army hospital into a domiciliary home for veterans, and the opening of O and C grant lands to mineral entry.

Pending legislation introduced during this Congress by Congressman Ellsworth include a bill to settle a jurisdiction dispute concerning the administration of certain forest lands, and a bill to provide for a planned program of access roads into government timber lands.

He is also the sponsor of several bills to authorize public works projects including Green Peter and Cougar dams in the Willamette Basin, and harbor projects at Gold Beach and at Reedsport. He is also working on the development of a harbor project for Brookings.

Congressman Ellsworth states that he will be unable to leave Washington while Congress is in session to make a primary campaign, but seeks the nomination on his record of good service.

### LOSES SISTER

Mrs. Goldie V. Smith, former postmistress in Brookings, and now a resident of Salem, Oregon, received word of the death of her youngest sister, Mrs. Elizabeth A. Santure March 1, 1954 in Richmond, California.

Mrs. Santure would have been 70 in June, and was a graduate nurse. She nursed for many years at St. Vincent's Hospital in Portland, and more recently in Richmond.

Mrs. Santure is survived by her husband, Isaac, and two sons, Richard and Donald, one in the Army Air Corps, and the other in the Navy Air Force.

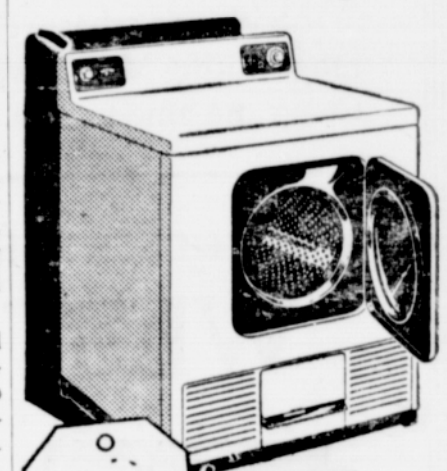
## OBEY CITATIONS, JUDGE SCHAAL WARNS
