

## CHARLES FRANKLIN DOANE

Democratic Candidate for County Judge

In 1906 Charles Doane was selling the Coos Bay Times on the streets of Marshfield, Oregon. He attended grade school at Marshfield, and, before going to school, always had a few cows to milk and the milk to deliver. He graduated from Marshfield High School in 1926. He drove a local bus at night to support his wife and family, while attending school. In 1932 he was elected County Commissioner in Coos County. He served from 1933 to 1936, inclusively. The county court of which he was a member did heroic work during the depression.

During World War II, Charles Doane worked as a civil service employee of the U. S. Engineers. He was with them from 1941 to 1951.

Charles Doane has been all over the United States, parts of Canada, Mexico, Central America, South Pacific, Hawaii, Canton Islands, Ellis Islands, and has traveled all over the Japanese Empire. He saw the effect of the atomic bomb at Nagasaki.

He came home to Langlois, and the stock ranch in 1952. Later, Mr. and Mrs. Doane sold their ranch on Floras Creek, which consisted of 2230 acres, to a Brookings farmer. In 1953 the Doanes moved to Gold Beach. Gold Beach is now Home-town.

Charles Doane is a member of the Sixes Grange, and has been for many years. He is also a member of the Pomona Grange. He is a member of the Masonic lodge at Port Orford.

Doane has seen a lot of people and places, and he can sincerely say that his heart is in Curry County. The beauty of the rivers and the streams of Curry County is unsurpassed, the coast scenery is marvelous. The Patterson bridge across the Rogue River is a jewel.

In regards to my candidacy for County Judge: I have had four years experience on a County Court. In some cases a County Judge should be ruthless, in other cases he should temper his justice

with mercy. I believe that Curry County should have a competent roadmaster. All duplication should be eliminated. The equipment should be standardized and centralized. I am not in favor of having a new Juvenile Court Probation Officer at this time. I believe expenses should be cut and

not increased. I believe the County Judge has plenty of time to take care of all juvenile cases. He also has plenty of time to go over all the county roads. The tax load is already too heavy. I believe in efficiency, change, progress, perfection and improvement.

The voters should remember that the County Court is a three man board. Two members of the County Court must agree, before any road matter or any other county business is transacted. A three man board is a tough board.

The Juvenile and Probate Courts are held by the County Judge.

In regards to a new county court house—let's wait until we have the money in the cash register. I think the farmers should conserve the soil, and I also think the County Court should conserve a few dollars. Keep Curry County out of debt, give the farmers and home owners a chance to live. When the time comes to build a new Court House, let's have a plan and a program.

Doane has made a concentrated study of business and finance for the past ten years. He knows you cannot get something for nothing. It is my opinion that the Tax-payers do not expect something for nothing, but they do expect efficiency and more for their money.

The time to prepare for a financial storm is NOW. Let's take in sail, before it is too late. Have more by spending less.

Charles Doane is not burdened by too much education. He has not had all the common sense educated out of him. He knows the wishes, desires and hopes of the people of Curry County. There is no use making a lot of big talk and foolish promises. He has seen and heard the Political Dogs bark and the Asses bray before. A County Judge should have his feet on the ground. He should do a lot of thinking. He should use a lot of discretion, common sense and consideration. Let's work together. In Union there is strength. We must have achievement and accomplishment. ## Easter Seal Campaign Opens In Curry

The 1954 Easter Seal campaign of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults opened today (March 18) throughout Curry county.

The sale will continue through Easter Sunday, April 18, according to Mrs. Glenn Rogers, Chairman for Curry county.

A total of approximately 2,500 Easter Seal letters will be mailed in Curry county during the next few days. The mailing for the entire state will be approximately 450,000 letters.

Mrs. Rogers expressed hope that Curry county "will respond generously so that the many services the society provides for the state's crippled children and adults can continue and possibly expand."

The sale of Easter Seals provides the society with nearly all of its funds, and the returns are used to:

1. Operate the Children's Hospital School in Eugene, where children from more than 20 Oregon counties are receiving special care, treatment and education;
  2. Provide a summer camp for crippled children near Reedsport, where youngsters can enjoy the outdoors under careful and expert supervision;
  3. Maintain a Craft Shop for the Handicapped in Portland, where articles made by physically handicapped are marketed to the public;
  4. Operate a speech center in Portland, which provides speech therapy for persons with speech problems, and
  5. Provide medical and surgical care for individuals unable to qualify for assistance from any other agency, either public or private.
- Many special events are planned in Curry county during the Easter Seal Sale period.
