The following additions to the Coos Curry Museum were announced by Mrs. Mary Randleman of the Museum Committee at the Saturday 13th meeting of the Coos-Curry Pioneer and Historical Association: By H. P. Hornish, Coos Bay, 3 copies of the newspaper "Bumble Bee" published in Coos Bay May and June 1874; Miss Anna Clinkenbeard, Coos Bay, a copy of her recent book, "Crossing the Plains" which gives the story of her own mother's experience in making the trip by covered wagon; Mrs. Augusta Stromquist of Coquille, a Swedish Bible; Mrs. W. M. ### 8½ Million In BPR Funds Given Oregon

A total of \$8,661,811 has been authorized as Federal aid to Oregon for highways in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1954, it was announced today by Ray Conway, general manager of the Oregon State Motor Association. The amount is this state's share of \$575 million authorized by the Federal-aid Highway Act approved June 25, 1952.

Of the total amount Oregon was authorized \$4,209,393 for its primary highway system; \$2,941,860 for secondary or feeder roads; \$1,081,596 for urban highways, and \$428,962 for the interstate system.

The funds became available to the states on January 1, 1954, and must be expended under supervision of the department's Bureau of Public Roads according to general procedure in use for many years in which state highway departments propose projects, prepare plans, award contracts, supervise construction, all subject to Federal approval. Federal participation is limited to half the cost except in the public-lands states there participation may be increased above 50 per cent by one-half of the percentage of the area of the state that is public land.

Funds for the Federal aid primary highway system are apportioned in proportion to area, population, and mileage of post roads, each being given equal weight. Funds for Federal aid secondary roads are apportioned in the same manner except that rural population is used rather than total population. Funds for urban projects
