### GUEST AT REDFIELD'S

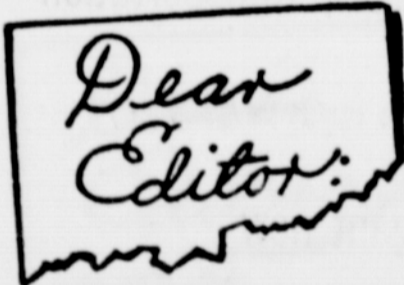
Mrs. Glessie Gates of Willetts, California, arrived Saturday to spend a few days with the Lyle Redfields on her way home from a visit with her children in Washington.
