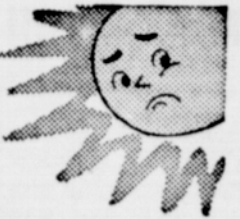
Damage to one of the parked cars was severe, and damage to the car driven by Miss Benson was also extensive.

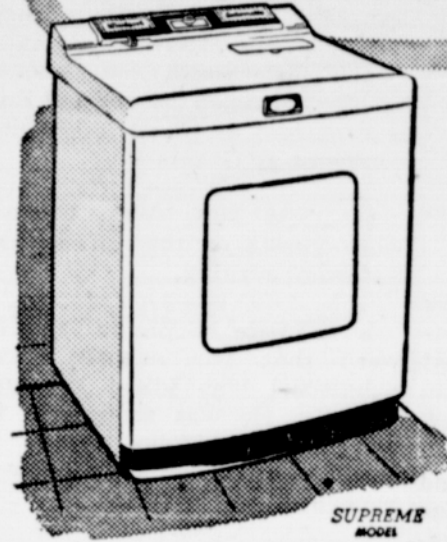
