During all those years, George's men never had a serious accident or fatality.

As a citizen he was loyal, faithful and true to his family, as well as with all with whom he became acquainted. He was loved and respected by his men. His hobbies consisted of two things: to work with wood, making things for his granddaughters, and fishing.

Finally, George always went beyond his line of duty to serve. All the citizens of Brookings have suffered a great loss.
