

Du Pont Manager Rotary Speaker

A talk on "Progress in Better Living" will be given here by Dr. Walter A. Dew, Pacific District Manager of the du Pont Company Extension Division, Public Relations Department. Dr. Dew, of San Francisco, California, is widely known as a speaker on industrial progress and chemical developments.

He will not only mention some of the newest developments in chemical research, but will also discuss what makes them possible and how they get out of the test tubes and into the hands of the public as useful products. He will also tell of such better known things as nylon and cellophane and how new things from the chemical industry contribute to a better standard of living.

As a result of his intimate knowledge of chemical developments with the du Pont Company, Dr. Dew says, "Industrial science is the new creative force in human affairs that has been responsible for more material progress than any mechanism ever developed in the history of man."

Dr. Dew has devoted most of his career to research, development, and production in the chemical industry. Within recent years he has become widely known as a speaker and author on developments in the chemical field.

He is a graduate of Princeton University, from which he received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in 1924. He joined du Pont that same year as a research chemist, later expanding his activities into development and production work for the company. In connection with his work, he is the author of many scientific papers and a number of United States and Canadian patents have been granted on his discoveries.

Dr. Dew has also been concerned with the training of operating supervisors in du Pont plants and had management responsibility in ordnance plants operated by the company for the Government. Also during the last war, he was connected with the Government's Manhattan project as a technical specialist.

After the war he became manager of the Eastern District of the Extension Division and in 1948 was appointed manager of the Pacific District.

A native of Wilmington, Del., he was active for many years in the Boy Scouts and school programs. He is a member of the American Chemical Society, Sigma Xi honor scientific research society, the American Institute of Chemical Engineers, and other organizations.

Local Seniors To Visit Colleges

Seniors of Brookings - Harbor high school have been invited to join graduating students throughout the state as honor guests of the state system of higher education during Senior Campus Preview, April 23 and 24. Seniors are invited to visit the campus of their choice in order to become acquainted with the state school they plan to attend.

The annual weekend event will be observed simultaneously at the University of Oregon, Eugene; Oregon State College, Corvallis; Oregon College of Education, Monmouth; Southern Oregon College of Education, Ashland; and Oregon Technical Institute, Klamath Falls.

Pre-college orientation of campus facilities has been arranged and all visiting students will have the opportunity of discussing educational plans with faculty advisers. Programs of entertainment have been scheduled, including sports events, mixer dances and firesides. Supervised housing will be arranged in authorized campus facilities.

Registration will begin at 7 p.m. Friday, April 23, at each campus. Seniors may obtain further information at the office of their principal.

Senior Campus Preview is an inter-campus program coordinated by the High School-College Relations committee of General Extension Division for the state system.

Oregon Renews 8 4-H Scholarships

Eight 1954 National 4-H awards programs, in which a total of 62 college scholarships valued at \$18,600.00 will be awarded to the highest rating winners, have been accepted by the State Extension Service.

The programs, number of \$300 national scholarships, and award donors are: Achievement, 12, Ford Motor Co.; Canning, 6, Kerr Glass; Farm and Home Electric, 6, Westinghouse Educational Foundation; Food Preparation, 8, Kelvinator; Girls' Record, 6, Montgomery Ward; Health, 8, Kellogg Co., of Battle Creek, Mich.; Home Improvement, 8, Sears-Roebuck Foundation, and Safety, 8, General Motors.

County awards in the programs have been increased to four gold filled medals of honor, with the exception of Food Preparation and Girls' Record, which offer one each.

State awards remain the same as in 1953. Each boy and girl state winner in the 4-H Achieve-

ment program will receive a set of two miniature statues, and state winners in the other seven programs will be awarded an all-expense trip to the annual Club Congress in Chicago. The number of sectional trips to the Chicago Congress offered in the Achievement activity have been increased from 16 to 24.

Each state winner in the above programs will be awarded a certificate of honor, as well as four 4-H Clubs in each county in the Safety program.

These national 4-H programs are all directed by the Cooperative Extension Service.
