### Brainard Goes To State Service Officers Meet

A school was held at Salem, three days last week, for county veterans' service officers and field representatives of the state veterans' bureau, with about forty men and women attending. M. S. Brainard was especially invited by the director, and was the only unsalaried person attending. C. E. Segar, Gold Beach, represented Curry County at the sessions.

Although the agenda concerned, primarily, home and ranch loans to qualified veterans, several other state and federal agencies contributed to the program because the group represented all of Oregon. Social Security, Re-employment, Education, Parole and Probation Rehabilitation, and Mental illnesses were on the list. One entire afternoon was spent at the Oregon State Hospital where Dr. Bower, of the staff, gave a lecture, with patients appearing, representing various types of mental disorders explained by the doctor.

It was brought out at the meeting that the home and ranch loan branch of the state veterans' bureau was a profitable institution of definite benefit to all communities of the state.
