STATE AWARDS 3 CONTRACTS IN COUNTY

Three contracts in Curry County were awarded last week by the Oregon State Highway Commission at its regular monthly meeting in Portland.

Hampton C. Platt of Salem was awarded a contract to build a caretaker's cottage at Harris Beach State Park, here in Brookings.

The contract calls for the construction of a 25 ft. by 32 ft. frame dwelling, with attached garage, in the newly-constructed trailer camp section of the park. Platt's bid was for \$8,830.00.

A similar house is to be constructed at Pistol River maintenance headquarters, and that bid also went to Platt, for \$8,730.

A contract to paint five highway bridges in Curry County on Highway 101 was awarded to Andrew Neshein, of Olympia, Washington, for \$23,964.00. Neshein will clean and paint the structural steel on the bridges over the Chetco, the Winchuck, the Elk, the Pistol and the Sixes.
