Deaths Up In Curry County Car Accidents

Coos county led the state in reducing traffic fatalities last year, cutting its deaths from 21 in 1952 to nine, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry reported today.

Newbry said final accident tabulations for the year revealed Multnomah county outside of Portland reduced its death toll by 11 and Tillamook county by eight.

Six other counties were just behind the top three in recording fewer traffic deaths, each with seven less than in 1952. Counties in the six-way tie were Deschutes, Washington, Yamhill, Klamath, Clatsop and Jackson. Curry county had 275 accidents, 74 persons injured and 4 deaths as compared with 301 accidents, 74 injuries and 3 deaths in 1952.

Newbry said total accidents in Oregon numbered 68,959, down about four percent from the 72,389 mishaps reported the year before. The number of persons injured, however, climbed from 15,125 to 15,563.

The cut-back in accidents is particularly heartening, the secretary said, because it was achieved in the face of increased motor vehicle registration and traffic volume.
