Young men and women facing the choice of a lifetime job might do well to consider floriculture, a field wide open, and with few applying themselves to it. The training is mostly along vocational lines and one learns by doing, although there are opportunities for advanced courses including the study of plant diseases, bugs, microbes, soil chemistry, etc., but the real demand is for what are known in the trade as "growers." There is a crying call for men or women who can produce salable plants from their propagation source and there is not a little pleasure as well as money connected with the deal. Usually, a "grower" starts as an apprentice, at low wages, which might be compared to the money one has to lay out for the usual college courses. For ladies, there is always work for designers, both for individual pieces, such as corsages and for funerals and for other occasions, as well as the actual growing of plants.
