DAIRY CALVES NEED MORE THAN PASTURE

Rushing small dairy calves onto pasture this spring is false economy that results in pot-bellied slow growers that fill up on grass without getting the concentrated feeds needed for good growth.

Dr. I. R. Jones, Oregon State college research dairyman, says the problem hinges to the fact that a calf's rumen at birth has a capacity of only about one-half gallon compared with 30 to 40 gallons in a mature animal.

For best gains, feeding trials show that calves from two to six months of age should receive 3 pounds of calf meal a day and all the hay they will eat while on pasture. The meal should be high in protein, including some animal protein, and provide a source of calcium and phosphorous for bone-building.

SALMON-STEELHEAD CARDSHAVE EXPIRED

Salmon - Steelhead anglers attention! The Oregon State Game Commission reminds all anglers that the current salmon-steelhead punch card expired March 31.

All of the license agencies of the state are prepared to receive the old cards and issue new ones which are good from March 31, 1954 to April 1, 1955.

Anglers possessing punch cards that expire at the end of this month are required by law to return them to the game commission not later than May 15, 1954. To facilitate the return, collection boxes have been placed in all license agencies.

A successful salmon and steelhead management program can only be realized through the cooperation of the anglers who harvest the fish. Without a knowledge of the catch, not only on a state-wide basis, but more important, by the major stream, the results of stream clearance, screening, planting, and regulation can never be properly assessed.
