1953 receipts from Christmas seal sales were up slightly from the year before, according to figures made public at the annual dinner of the Curry County TB and Health Association.

Mrs. Irene Koeller of Brookings reported sales of 1,556.75 for the county up about \$100 from 1954.

The Association heard reports from their heads at the annual meeting, held at the Sunset Inn in Gold Beach, and elected their directors for next year.

State Health Education Chairman Don Beagle of Portland told the group of educational activities which are being carried out by the Association throughout the

state. Also addressing the group was Mrs. Dortha Miller, County Nurse, who told the group of the trials and the growth of the educational program of public health in the county.

The group went on record at the meeting as favoring the employment of a full-time Sanitarian for Curry County.
