

Scout Building Group Asks Support of Community

To all Scouters, Sponsors and anybody working or interested in Boy and Girl Scouts:

This Scout Building is a Community Project. In the past years all of the different organizations and individuals have helped get the project along as far as it is. The land is all free and clear, and we have the good will of the City Council. All property owners around the Scout Land are in favor of this sort of building in their district.

Our Committee is dis-organized at present. This is due to different individuals leaving town. This committee must be re-organized to help completion of this building. As most of the public knows this building is to be a meeting place for all Scouts, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Explorer Scouts and Girl Scouts.

It seems important that there'll be representatives from all of the different organizations in town, to function at these meetings and help on the actual construction of this building. Right now there are several organizations sponsoring different groups of Scouts that are renting meeting places for their boys and girls. Completion of this building will stop all of this.

The construction of this building has no connections with the Oregon Trail Council, at Eugene, Oregon. There is no support of this building from funds collected each year by this council in our area. Their plan is that each sponsor-

ing organization is to provide a meeting place for whatever group they are handling. Well, the way the original Building Committee planned, was to have a building for a meeting place for any boy or girl Scout. The funds raised on these drives are supposed to pay wages and mileages for Boy Scout Fieldmen to help the local sponsors keep their programs going. Also they are supposed to train Scout masters, Den Mothers, Cub Master etc.

A copy of this letter is being sent to all of the different organizations in our city. The purpose of this is to get a good committee working again. After all it is these organizations that are sponsoring the different units of Scouting. Therefore, we need representatives from these organizations, to be present at these meetings, and the full support of the organizations in completion of this building. We would like to see 2 committeemen or more from each organization present at the meeting Friday, April 30th. There must be a Chairman appointed to work with Mr. Blaine Gribble, building chairman.
