

Drive Begins For Membership In Community Concert Series Here

A drive for Community Concerts memberships in the Brookings-Harbor area begins this week, under the direction of Mrs. Helen Dempsey.

All of the workers and members of the Board of Directors will be honored at a buffet 'kick-off' dinner, to be held May 10 at the Federal Community church recreation hall, in Crescent City.
