STUDENTS HEAR TURKISH TEACHER

Ibrahim Ozgentas, a teacher in a high school in Konya, Turkey, addressed the students at the Brookings-Harbor High School on Wednesday afternoon. Mr. Ozgentas is one of a number of Turkish educators visiting this country under sponsorship of the Turkish government and Ford Foundation with the intention of demonstrating our system of education and way of life. He will spend a year in the United States, mainly at the University of Illinois at Champaign.

NEW CRAFT TRIED ON RIVER HERE

A new craft hit the Chetco last week—with a resounding roar.

The new vessel is an air-boat, constructed here by Rex Hayes. The air boat is a flat bottomed craft, which is driven forward by an airplane propeller, powered by a four cylinder airplane motor.

In trial runs, the craft hit excellent speeds, although Rex says he will have to do some weight adjustments. On early runs, he reported the bow too heavy to give the craft the speeds it should have.

Rex brought back the idea for the air-boat from Florida, where he had seen them perform. He thinks they'll be an excellent boat for the shoals of rivers such as the Chetco.
