**Beavers Meet
Cavemen Twice
Here Sunday**

The Brookings Beavers will inaugurate the 1954 Southern Oregon league baseball season here Sunday afternoon when they meet the Grants Pass Cavemen in a double header starting at one o'clock on the new diamond near the Plywood plant.

The Brookings club will not be at full strength for the first two week-ends. Tony Troncale, pitcher from Pepperdine College in Los Angeles, is expected to be on hand for the series at Coquille on June 5th and 6th. Bob Selsor, hard hitting infielder with the Beavers last year, writes that he expects to be back by June 20th. Selsor is currently hitting 378 to lead the Long Beach City College team which boasts 34 wins and only 4 losses.

Bob Astin and Jim Barrett are expected to handle the pitching chores in the two Sunday games. The starting line-up will probably see Len Reynoldson on 1st, Cliff Girod on 2nd, Boyd Westernen at shortstop and Bud Lowe on 3rd with Lee Goodin, Ken Kimura and Bill McLean manning the outfield. McLean played for the Beavers during the 1950 and '51 seasons and Sunday will mark his first appearance before Brookings fans since Bill completed his two-year army hitch. Lloyd Russell will do the catching. Ron Westernen and Bill Darnell are also likely to see action.

The Beavers were able to book only two scheduled pre-season games, winning from Crescent City Merchants by a 7 to 2 score,
