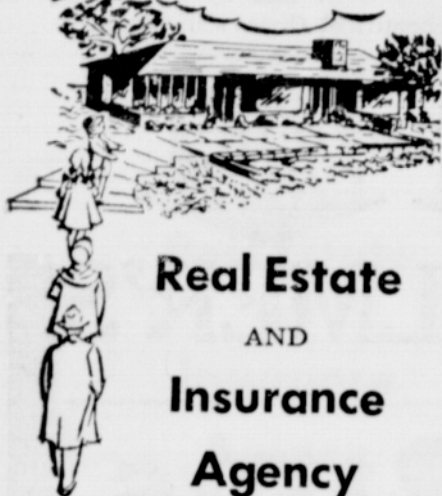

## SCHOOL BUDGET, NEW DIRECTORS TO BE DECIDED

Main provisions of the new budget call for stepped up spending necessitated by the phenomenal growth of local schools in recent years. In the main, the greater part of the increased expense may be broken into, three parts. Funds needed to aid our full-time and one part time teacher to the staff; funds needed to equip the new high school now being built, and funds to finance increased interest on the bond issue which is financing the new school.

Board members pointed out that, even with local construction the budget is about the same as it would have been under the County School system. And increased valuation locally is expected to reduce millage considerable next year.

The three new Directors to be elected will replace the retiring Director, Harold Crump. The Board will increase to five with this election, since the local district grew into a first class district this year.

The new Directors will be nominated by petition. Candidates must file a petition signed by at least ten registered voters with the school clerk at least a week before the election. However, the nomination is void, unless a certificate of acceptance is filed by the candidate five days prior to the election.

Voters of School District 17-C will go to the polls June 21st in a two-fold election.

On that day, they will vote on whether to approve a school budget which exceeds the 6 per cent limitation by \$76,458.99. and, on the same day, they will elect three new directors for the school board to serve three, four and five year terms respectively.

The school budget vote will be preceded by a school meeting, set for June 10 at 7:30 P. M., at which interested people may analyze the budget in detail.

## Fire Petitions In Circulation

Petitions prepared by the State Fire Marshall's office for the proposed Harbor Fire Prevention District are being circulated in the area between the Chetco River and the State line, starting the middle of this week. In order to have a vote taken on the formation of such a district, it is necessary to secure two hundred signatures of persons owning property in the area, or twenty five percent of the property owners, whichever is the lesser.

After the required valid signatures are secured, the county court will set a hearing on whether the proposed boundaries are right, after which an election is held in the district on whether such a Fire Prevention District is wanted or not, and to elect a board of five directors.

In signing the petitions, if the property is in the name of both a husband and wife, both may sign and be counted toward the required number of signatures.
