**NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION UPON QUESTION OF INCREASING TAX LEVY OVER AMOUNT LIMITED BY SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI, STATE CONSTITUTION**

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 17C of Curry County, State of Oregon, at School House June 21, 1954, at 8 o'clock P. M. in said district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1954 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:

1. Increased cost of operating additional High School Building, lockers and bleachers for the new building.

2. 4½ additional Elementary teachers; 1 additional High School teacher.

3. Increased operational costs. The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$76,458.99.
