## RODEO ADDED TO LILY DAYS

Signing of a rodeo to play in Brookings during Lily Blossom Days was announced this week by the Chetco Wranglers.

The rodeo will inaugurate the Wrangler's new rodeo ground, completed recently. It will be held Saturday and Sunday, July 10 and 11.

The Lily parade Sunday will begin at 12:30 P. M., so that it can be completed before the rodeo begins. Starting time for the rodeo will be 2:30 P. M. both days.

A full program of events is planned for the two days. There will be saddle bronc riding, calf roping, bull riding, bull dogging and wild cow milking.

Parking for the rodeo has been turned over to the Boy Scouts by the Wranglers, and all proceeds from the ten cent parking fee will go to the scouts.

This will mark the first time that the Lily Festival has had a major companion attraction in addition to the parade. The rodeo is expected to bring a large addition to Lily day visitors here.

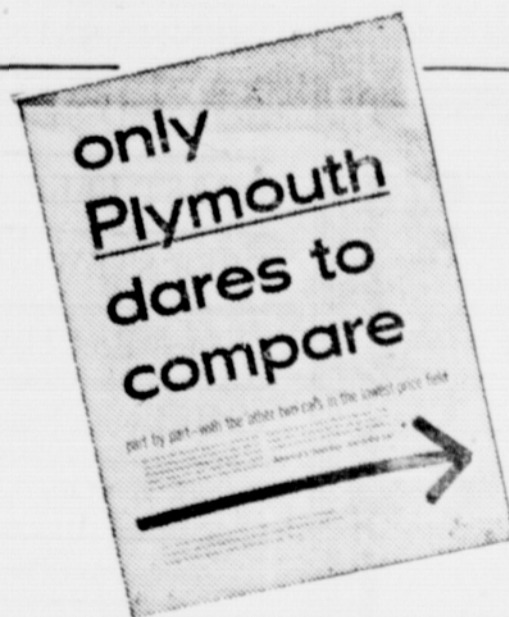

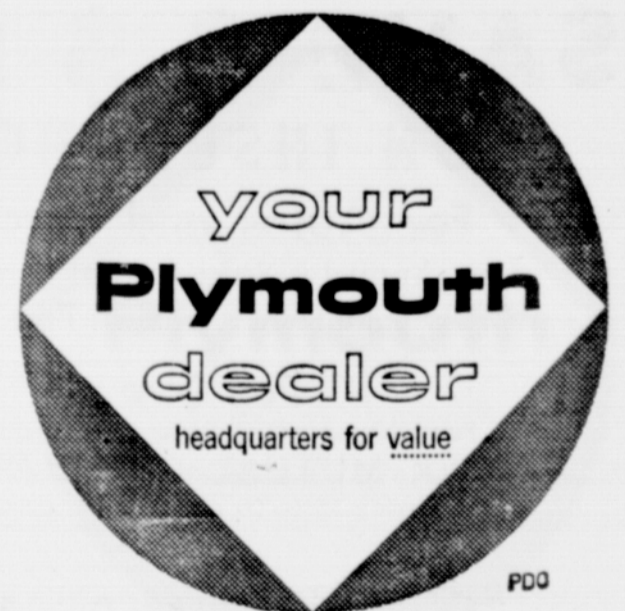
