FORD AGENCY BEING BUILT IN BROOKINGS

Work was underway this week on a new Ford agency, being constructed in 'Automobile Row' in North Brookings.

The new agency will be Dunning Motors, and will replace Pacific Motors, a used car company which has operated on the same site. Dunning Motors has a franchise as Ford Dealer for Curry County.

The firm is owned by George Dunning, previously of Portland, who has been in the automobile business for fifteen years. Dunning, who has moved to Brookings, previously had a Ford agency in Portland, as well as other automotive firms.

Tom Dent, who has managed Pacific Motors here, will remain as manager of the new firm.

Also coming from Portland to be with the new firm is Hugo Mackey, Service Manager, Mary Evelyn Munley, Office Manager and James Holcomb, Ford Mechanic who has been with Kupp Ford Co. in Portland the last five years.

Contestants will throw double-bladed axes which weight at least 2½ pounds with 24 inch handles at an 8 inch bull's-eye at a distance of 21 feet or more.

A total of \$200.00 in cash will be given to the top four winners with first place giving \$100.00 and second place \$50.00. This event is being offered in addition to World Championship high-climbing, topping, bucking, chopping, and birling. Timber Carnival this year offers over \$3000.00 in awards to woodsmen for speed and skill.

All loggers events in the World Championship Carnival will be held in the natural amphitheater of Waverly Lake on the north side of Albany.
